WALDEN LAKE NEIGHBOR HOSTS DRIVE-BY LUNCHEON

On Thursday, January 14, a muscle car led a line of well-wishers past the Walden Lake residence of Attorney Jeraldine Williams. The 75-year-old native of Ybor City sat in a high-back leather chair on an oriental rug, sipped her champagne and greeted passersby with a royal wave.

The Covid-19 virtual birthday luncheon was enhanced by a storyboard of Williams' 75 year Celebration of Life. Five 3' x 8' colorful banners that were erected to remind some, and introduce other family, friends, and neighbors to the honoree's vibrant right-of-passage into the *GRITS* (**G**irls **R**aised **In The South**) Society.

Caveat: Williams, an African American, grew up in the racially segregated central Florida city of Tampa. Her visual autobiography reflects her transitions such as moving from an all-Black grade school to integrating the University of Florida's

College of Journalism and Communications, being recognized as the first Black ever to win in the National Hearst Journalism Competition, serving as an official observer in South Africa's first election in which Africans were allowed to vote.

Her five picture panels presented Jeraldine: "Down through the Ages," from pre-school to today; "With..." dignitaries and politicians including: US Vice President Hubert Humphrey, US President Jimmy Carter, South Africa President Nelson Mandela, Liberia President Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf, United States ambassadors, Muhammad Ali, and Denzel Washington; "With..." family members; "Enjoying" horseback riding, scuba diving, hot air ballooning, and white water rafting; and "Traveling In..." destinations such as South Africa, Morocco, Egypt, London, Paris, Turkey, Germany, Netherlands.

Guests presented a bounty of gifts, and accepted a savory take-away lunch of stewed chicken breast, mashed potatoes, string beans, dinner roll, and peach cobbler.

Popular and gospel music whirled through warm and still airwaves, while the aroma of barbequing pork and chicken aroused Southern palates.

SAFETY FIRST – SPEEDING, GOLF CARTS, CRIME, WILDLIFE

WLCA is committed to your safety and that of your neighbors. The Board has renewed periodic meetings with the new Chief of Police to discuss safety issues and enforcement. Please remember that the main roads in Walden Lake are Plant City streets with rules and regulations enforced by the Plant City Police Department.

SPEEDING: The Police Department has been informed of the numerous complaints of speeding throughout the community. As a result the PD has stepped up speed enforcement and will continue to do so.

GOLF CARTS: The WLCA Golf Cart policy adheres to the County and City ordinances and applies when operating a cart on

community property. The policy includes driver's license requirement (age restriction), insurance requirement, etc. Please see our full policy in the 'Resources' tab of the WLCA website.

CRIME: We are fortunate to live in a community where crime is low. That said, Walden Lake still experiences occasional crimes of opportunity. PCPD reminded us that you can easily prevent such crimes by locking your doors at night, locking your car at night and NOT leaving valuables in plain sight in your vehicle.

WILDLIFE: All of the abundant wildlife found in Walden Lake should be respected and left alone. This includes our **Alligator** population. The gator mating season has begun and we have had reports of gator sightings on several of our ponds and big lake. This is normal at this time of year.

We live in alligator territory and need to coexist with these *protected* reptiles. WLCA does not trap, remove, or otherwise interact with alligators. If an alligator is being *aggressive towards humans*, you or WLCA can contact the Florida Fish and Wildlife



Conservation Commission (FWC). If they confirm the aggressive behavior, they may employ a trapper to try and catch the reptile which would then be euthanized.



CART TO CURB AUTOMATED

TRASH COLLECTION

The City of Plant City had the new trash carts in our office for a couple of weeks before they needed to take them to another community. The picture gives you a visual of the difference in size. The smallest cart is 30 gallons, the medium is 65 gallons and the

large is 95 gallons. You can go to the city's website and have most of your questions answered about the program. We do not have the room to answer all the many questions, but the most common question was *Will my monthly rate for solid waste collection change? Below is the answer.*

Yes. The rates for the new program are: \$27.50 for 95-gallon cart, \$25.50 for 65-gallon cart and \$23.00 for 35-gallon cart. This includes the same level of service currently provided: trash collection twice weekly, recycling and yard waste collection once weekly, bulk items collected as needed, and one free grabber load collected per 12 month period. Front door service will still be provided for qualified residents.
